Message from Burford Hurry

President – Mediterranean Gardening Association Portugal

Living in Portugal, particularly the Algarve, we have come to realise that winter has a particular significance here. Unlike our northern European counterparts, we are spared snow and ice, and in return, although we have colder weather, we also have rain and sunny days. The result is that our gardens don't have to be wrapped up and protected for winter. In fact, in many cases, it is showtime. In a way autumn prepares us for that, with gorgeous *Amaryllis belladonna* 'suddenly' appearing in our gardens, and in my patch the branches of a small almond tree hung with the small white bells of *Clematis cirrhosa*. All these followed in quick succession by the first flowering antlers of the aloes, so that by the time January arrives we have the fiery red heads of *Aloe arborescens* setting fire to the garden. In the *campo* there are clouds of delicate pink and white almond blossom and fragile *Narcissus papyraceus*, and groves of Citrus trees fill the air with their beauty and their perfume. Winter is special in this part of the world.

Autumn and winter is also time for planting, and with this in mind we held our Autumn Fair in São Brás on the last Saturday in October last year. Once again it was very successful. We were helped in this regard by good early rains, which encouraged people to buy and plant. Hopefully, the rains will also have encouraged us to prepare our spring gardens and in turn ready ourselves for the onslaught of summer. I was reminded of the latter last week in an email from Caroline Davies, the president of the MGS, when she mentioned the daily temperatures of 40 degrees in Melbourne.

2018 also saw the gradual development of the MGAP botanic garden near Silves, and a recent popular seed and cuttings event as well as donations have underlined the interest in its further development.

In March this year we will be having an international conference in Évora with the theme '**Bringing the Mediterranean Landscape Into Your Garden**' with practical key note speakers such as Olivier Filippi, James Basson and others. It will be an extremely rewarding event for those enthusiastic gardeners participating, and I look forward to meeting some of you there.

On that very positive note may I take this opportunity to wish you all a very good gardening year.

“Bringing the Mediterranean Landscape Into Your Garden”




The 2019 Conference weekend will be based in Évora 4 to 8 April, with a pre-tour (1 to 4 April) in the Algarve, including the Barrocal Botanic Garden, private garden visits and wildflower walks. We are very happy to confirm that our Keynote Speakers on Saturday 6 April in Évora will be **Olivier Filippi** author of masterworks on Dry Gardening in the Mediterranean climate zones www.jardin-sec.com and **James Basson** of Scape Design Studio www.scapedesign.com. Working in the South of France for over 18 years, James has established a reputation for creating low maintenance, dry gardens that mix contemporary design with traditional skills. His Gold Medal—winning gardens at the Chelsea Flower Show include the use of native plants in a recreated Maltese Quarry.

We are working closely with Évora University for this event, and we hope to attract students on relevant courses to join us. NEWS FROM MEDITERRANEAN GARDENING INTERNATIONAL



Another new group has been accepted into the Mediterranean Gardening International family, The Okanagan Xeriscaping Association (OXA) has become the latest member, taking the number of organisations to eight. The society is a valuable addition to our already very international organisation with much in common with other Mediterranean climate areas.

The Okanagan Valley is located in BC's southern interior and is the northern part of a large desert region stretching south to the peninsula of Baja California in Mexico. The region has hot dry summers (25 - 35°C) and cold winters, (average low temperature -8°), so pretty similar to the climate in Mediterranean France, though Okanagan has more snow than we do. It is a major centre for the cultivation of fruit trees and vines. Alfredo Unda from Chile visited the group and was received warmly by OXA. He was impressed by the quality of the work the association is doing to educate the community in dry gardening techniques, and by the demonstration garden they have created. He wrote an [article](#) about his visit for the Mediterranean Gardening Chile website. I was hugely impressed by their website, especially the extensive illustrated plant database.

The Okanagan Xeriscape Association was founded in British Columbia, Canada in 2009 to educate the community about gardening with nature and conserving water while creating attractive and colourful landscapes. By 2010, creation of a xeriscape demonstration garden was underway to inspire people to use native and Mediterranean-type (drought-resistant) plants in order to reduce the use of outdoor water and produce healthy plants using fewer pesticides.

Classes, workshops for professionals and the public, presentations, a brochure, website and detailed plant database are all tools used by OXA to support the principles of xeriscape.

Volunteers, community groups, businesses and governments all worked collaboratively to create the UnH2O Xeriscape Demonstration Garden in front of the City of Kelowna's aquatic building, the H2O Adventure and Fitness Centre.
